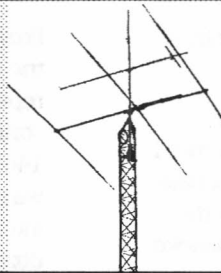

"That's All, Folks"...

Many of you probably remember those words from the old movie cartoons. They meant that the cartoon feature had come to an end. Sooooo, what does that mean to us? Well, we have come to the end of one phase and the beginning of another with our "76" repeater. The hard-working crew

finished raising the antenna higher on the tower and has put the finishing touches on all of the adjustments of the new repeater system. OK, so, what does that mean? Very simply stated, it means that what you hear is what you will get on 146.760. The new site is not as high as Carter's Mountain was, but we don't seem to have any intermod or other interference at this time. Recent checks have shown that dozens and dozens of stations have reported excellent reception with the new location and also the ability to access the repeater with lower power and smaller antennas. Does that include you?

Possibly not and that's the reason for this month's column. If you are not having the results you desire and that may mean that you can no longer use an HT and "rubber duck" and you could before the loss of Carter's, all is not lost. You may have to give up that favorite easy chair, the porch swing or some other very comfortable spot, but you can move about your house looking for a "hot spot!" That's a place where the repeater signal is fairly strong and you can still use your HT/rubber duck. Move your easy chair to this location and you're in business!

OK, that solution didn't work for you! What next? Well, how about building a small ground plane or even better... a vertical dipole that could be hung from a window or some other support near a "hot spot?" Do you have a second floor, attic or crawl space? If so, put an antenna in that location and bring some RG-58/U through a closet that goes between floors. A small diameter hole in the closet ceiling won't be noticed and can be covered later with spackle (or "mud" as they say hereabouts!) Still not good enough? Well, you can build a small 3 or 4-element beam and direct it at the repeater. After all, that's really the only radio you're trying to reach... right? The beam might be hidden within the room or put in that upper area. Incidentally, not mentioned, but also a possible solution is a gain antenna... not a ground plane or dipole, but an elongated vertical... you will hear them called 5/8 wave verticals. They will topple most of the miniature HT's but you can solve that problem by securing the HT-5/8 combo in a "hot spot" near your favorite location in the house and then use a hand microphone with a cable made for the distance to your comfy chair!

Of course, there is always that old devil... "POWER!" You can use a small amplifier or even a larger one and put a big signal into your antenna. I prefer to leave power to the very last in any discussion about improvement in signal. All of the other solutions are easier and cheaper and frequently more effective.

Well, fellow club members, there are some items to consider. We can discuss them further at a meeting, on the air or OCB on Wednesday. Good luck.

They are encouraged, but are not required, to contact the current Officers and Directors to determine their interest in being renominated.

Following the elections, the new President-Elect is encouraged to begin consideration of whom he/she desires to fill the committee positions established in the Bylaws. Positions Open - Help Wanted

I will NOT be returning as Secretary. That Office will definitely require a new person to take on the responsibilities as are normally required. Neither will I be serving as Publication Committee Chair or doing those other activities, which I have been doing for nearly seven years. Therefore, the following position and activities will need to be filled by appointment or assigned to someone new.

Publications Committee Chair (Presidential appointment with Board approval)

A. Directory development and publishing: (2001).

Design and publish the AARC Directory, beginning with the 2001 Directory. The 2000 Directory will soon be available. A new format must be developed by the person undertaking this responsibility. The Directory is published once each year. My directories were basically designed within the database software I used.

B. Database maintenance: Manage the AARC database and maintain information about area Hams and AARC membership. Preparation of mail labels for the AARC requirements will be required. The current database file

information will be passed on to the next individual using a tab-delimited file. No retyping of basic data should be required. This also requires checking the 4-5 days of FCC license reports each week and keeping tabs on other changes in basic information. The Database contains the foundation information for the Directory, the AARC membership and other possible reports.

C. Mailing labels: Primary needs are for the newsletters and the directories that are mailed.

NOTE: It is strongly recommended that the same person do A, B and C above. All involve the Database.

D. Awards:

HF Operating Certificates- The AARC has several Awards for HF contacts. Each has had a special certificate design established. The individual assigned to manage this activity will need to design new certificates. Actually, the design is only the within-the-border portion, since we use stock bordered sheets. This activity is not frequently used and design time should be sufficient. The records of the previous awards issued will be provided.

Public Service Certificates- Each year we present these certificates to individuals who have achieved specified levels of Public Service activity. The database information of this activity will be turned over to the next person responsible for this activity. I will be responsible for the 2000 certificates that will be presented at the January, 2001 meeting. New certificates will need to be designed. The current ones are part of a database and automatically update and print the selected certificates.

Ham of the Year Certificate- This will need to be newly designed. Past records will be passed on to next person. Examples of all certificates will be passed on to the individual(s) responsible for the new designs. It is unlikely that current designs can be maintained.

E. AARC Web Site: For the last few years, I have maintained the AARC Web site. The web site has resided on my AOL account. An individual is needed to develop a new AARC Web site and maintain it. The new Webmaster will need to design a new web site on a new location. There are various possibilities for this. Some are free and some will cost. I will pass on my web pages, if possible. Under any circumstance, I will maintain the current, reduced number of web pages until the new site is established. When the new site is ready, I will maintain a web page that will redirect all current, incoming links to the new site. This will be true for as long as I am on AOL.

The software I have relied on extensively is a database program called FileMaker Pro (FMP). It is now produced by FileMaker, Inc., a subsidiary of Apple Computer. Originally developed for the Macintosh, it is now available for the Wintel machines. I maintained the data about area Hams. This included the membership of the AARC. The same file

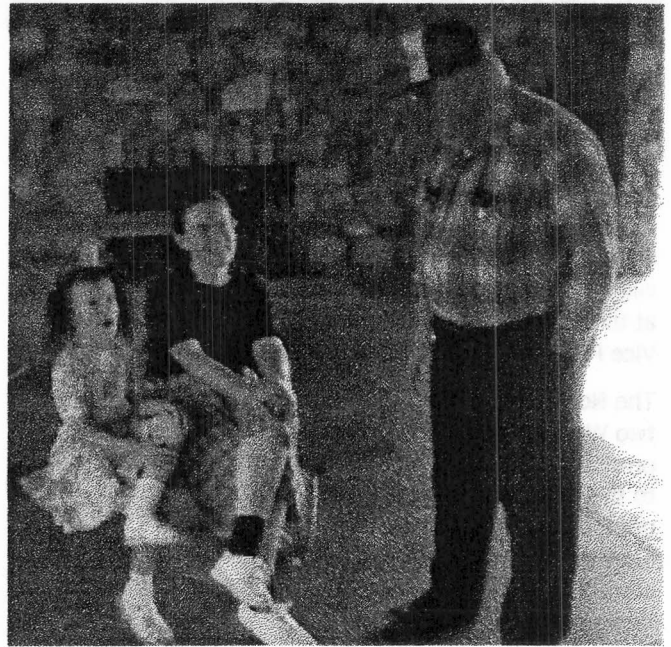
was structured to do about 95% of the Directory. Labels were produced by this file. All certificates were produced by FileMaker Pro. Separate FMP files were setup for managing the Awards certificates and the Public Service Events certificates.

The Web pages were developed and maintained using Claris Home Page 2.0 and 3.0. This Macintosh software also has a Wintel version. I will work closely with the new individual(s) during the transition phase. There is NO requirement to use this software. I am sure other Wintel software will work. In any case, a lot of design work will be involved, just as it was for me.

At this time, as the Publications Committee Chair, I am asking any individual who might be interested in doing any of the above activities and has experience in using the appropriate software, to please contact me. Having an existing AOL account might be a plus. Having an ISP account is a must. AARC Board Minutes August 1, 2000

Attending: Pres. Bob-K4DU; Vice Pres. Dick-W4BZW; Sect. Joe-KD4RWX; Tres. Sharon-KO4OC; Dir. Mike-N4HRO; Dir Elmer-KF4UCI; Dir. Mike-AC4ZQ. Bob Pattison-K4DU presiding. Absent: Pete-KC4UCK and Jimmy-K4JMY were either ill or injured.

Sharon reported that there was \$4,136 in the bank. She indicated the equipment insurance was due. A discussion concerning if it should be paid or if we should self-insure ensued. Reflections on the Carters disaster, in which the

insurance played no role were made. A motion was made and passed to self-insure.

Bob directed Sharon to ask the ARRL what the cost would be on the new repeater. Mike-N4HRO asked if listing area repeaters in the newsletter was appropriate. No problem was mentioned. Mike said he would put together a list and submit it to newsletter Editor.

Pete-KC4UCK was not present due to injury. Bob asked that we need to proceed on the PR of upcoming classes. Bill-KC4TQF will be notified. He will be the instructor. *[Note: a few weeks after this meeting, Bill sent in his resignation as Education Committee Chair and indicated he would not be able to serve as instructor. He cited health and personal reasons.]*

Elmer indicated that the 146.76 repeater would be activated at the new repeater site very soon. He suggested that efforts to ready the 220 repeater need to be redoubled.

A question was asked concerning the location of some of the Club's TNCs. It was suggested that a check with AD4AD was in order.

Dick asked for guidance on the quantity of drinks to purchase for the picnic. Suggestions were made.

Joe mentioned that a Bylaw amendment will be part of upcoming business. Pointed out the requirement of the President to nominate a five (5) person Nominating Committee at the September meeting and he urged the proposed slate be sent to the Secretary in time for the September newsletter.

Joe indicated that for 2001, he would not return in an elected capacity and that he would not be doing the Publication Committee duties he presently does. Therefore, many and varied responsibilities will be reassign for next year. *[See related article in the September newsletter for details.]*

The New AARC 6.76 Repeater Site - In Pictures !!!

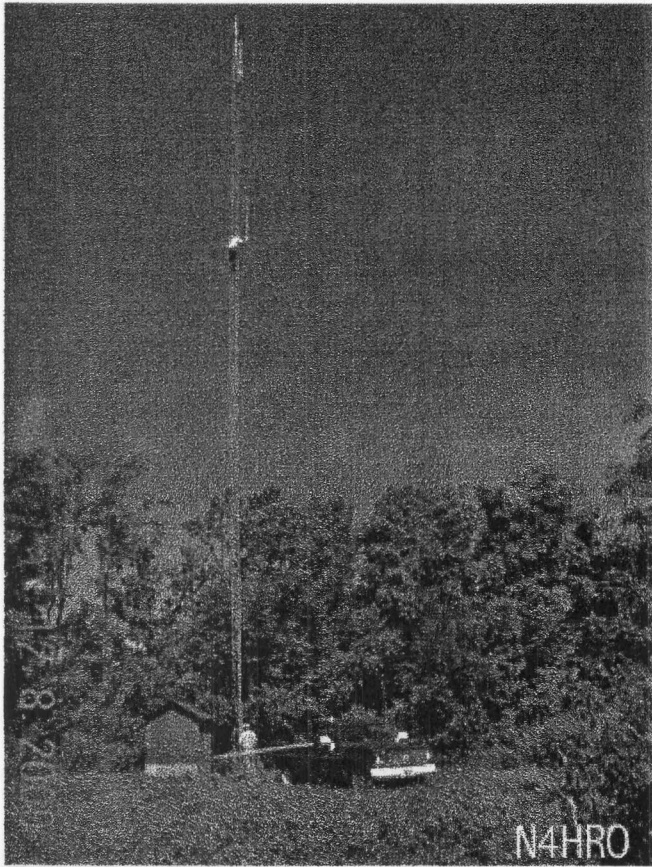

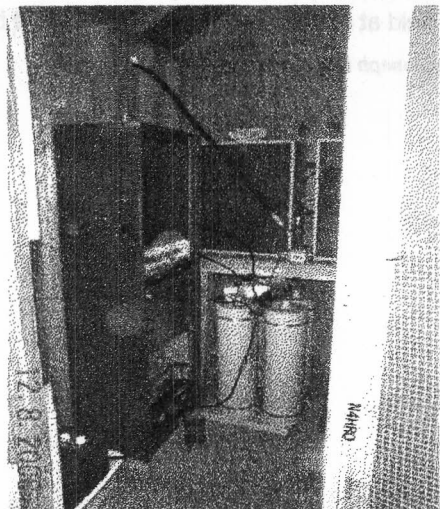
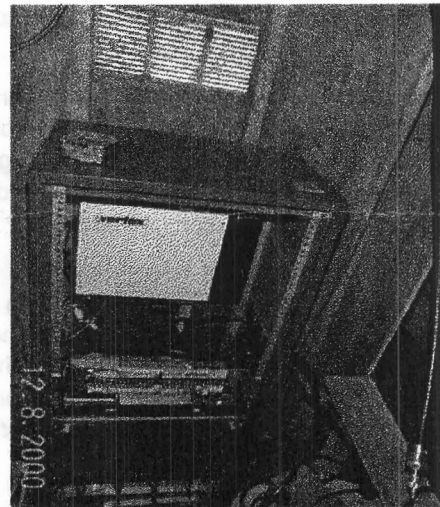
And this is what it looks like from Elmer's point of view ...
