

David Sumner K1ZZ made some relevant comments in the December QST column "It Seems to Us". Sumner says "*For people who are just becoming acquainted with Amateur Radio the most important community is likely to be a local radio club. When a newcomer encounters a group that enjoys doing things together and sharing their passion for radio with one another, when the first-time visitor is made to feel welcome, he or she is likely to return.*"

He goes on to observe "*But a welcoming club doesn't just happen. It takes officers who are willing to devote the time to building a team, planning programs and activities, and seeing that the myriad tasks that are required to sustain a volunteer organization are all getting done. 

Those of you who attended the November AARC meeting got a chance to meet Kenneth Kang KJ4KIH, and see his informative presentation on the new aspects of the AARC website. For those of you not present at the last AARC meeting, let me introduce you to Kenneth.

Kenneth was born in Georgia, so has legitimate claim to being a "southerner". He attended Stanford University in California, and graduated with a degree in Computer Science. Kenneth says with some regret, that while he was busy pursuing his degree, he saw others drop out and start small companies such as


Whether you have a story to tell, hint to share, report on some activity you participated in, special interest of yours, whatever.... It will be of interest to other club members.
