#### BEHIND THE CALL

#### MY FAVORITE HAM EXPERIENCE

I first became aware of Amateur Radio when I was eleven years old. I lived in a double house in Ardmore, Pennsylvania and a friend of mine who lived in the other half of the house got his license. Bob had a Hammarlund HO140 receiver and a WRL. Globe Scout transmitter, I became aware of Amateur Radio because I could hear the K3JJJ calling CQ and making contacts on CW through those paper thin walls at all times of night and day. I had always been interested in far away places. It didn't take more than one visit to Bob's shack and I knew that I

wanted to be an Amateur Radio operator too!

When my birthday rolled around my Dad offered to let me chose between a "English" bicycle or a receiver. Even though I had never owned a bicycle, that was an easy choice. I started out with a Lafavette regenerative receiver kit. I started studying for my Novice license and soon graduated to a Hallicrafters S-38 receiver and a Heathkit DX40 transmitter. I still have fond memories of those crystal controlled days on 80, 40 and 15. My original call was KN3SZD. Since then my calls have included KA8DOX, N4ROD and of course KM4DU.

Amateur Radio has played an important role in my life. It has given me a great deal of pleasure and a number of very good friends. Through Amateur Radio I have learned that I can accomplish anything that I want to if I am willing to invest the time and effort to see things through. My current interests include antennas, contesting, county hunting and recruiting people into the hobby. I also enjoy teaching Amateur Radio Classes and serving as a Volunteer Examiner.

During the course of the past several years I have also had the pleasure of floating down the James on a Bateaux, communicating from the midst of a civil war reenactors encampment, crawling on roofs at the Louisa County Court House, The Red Cross and pulling cable in the elevator shaft at Martha Jefferson hospital all in the name of Public Service. HAMS FIND DOWNED RC PLANE. TWICE By Bill Arnold, KD4TOR

MILTON, VA -- In a dramatic rescue on Sunday April 18, two Amateur Radio operators assisted by skilled pilots flying radio controlled aircraft, located a fuel-starved RC aircraft that had abruptly landed on the far bank of the beautiful Rivanna River across from Milton Field. The crash occurred on a cloudless day near the flying field used by the Rivanna Radio Control Club a scant four miles from historic Monticello, home of Thomas Jefferson.

The plane's builder, owner and pilot, a ham radio operator who asked that he be identified only as KB2XX, noticed a problem during a routine training flight, Realizing that Willard (Bunky) Deane, an experienced RC pilot, was nearby, KB2XX requested his assistance, Mr. Deane, an expert at recognizing fuel problems in RC aircraft, immediately discovered the difficulty and ably brought the craft as close as he could to the field before it disappeared below the leafy horizon. A scouting party soon spotted the wreckage resting on the opposite bank well above the Rivanna's turbulent waters

KB2XX and an assistant drove to a development over a mile from the site of the mishap and using a 2 meter HT made contact with KD4TOR, who with Deane was keeping the craft in view. Then in a masterful demonstration of flying skill, W. C. (Will) Dirickson of Charlottesville, Va., flew his Spacewalker, an RC plane with a 9 foot wingspan, from the runways at Milton to a spot directly over the downed craft. From his vantage point, KB2XX saw the orbiting plane, used it for reference and advised KD4TOR that he was on his way to the crash site.

After assessing the damage, KB2XX asked KD4TOR to notify his wife, via cellular telephone, that he would be later than expected. Unfortunately, a scrumptious dinner was simultaneously nearing the table.

KB2XX had a second mishap with the same plane two weeks later. Again the team of Dirickson and KD4TOR assisted in locating it. This time Dirickson flew his plane along the line of last visual sighting while KD4TOR advised the wooded KB2XX that the airborne plane appeared to be in the vicinity of the mishap. The technique was again successful in vectoring KB2XX to his downed craft, most of which had rapidly come to rest in the top of a tall tree.

This method for locating crash sites may prove useful in the future. The crew of KB2XX, Dirickson and KD4TOR, which has become known as the Schwartz Team, has agreed to provide this service to the club whenever necessary.

#### PUBLIC EVENTS 1994

MSB1. MSB2--Multiple Sclerosis Bike Tour Saturday 11 June and Sunday 12 June 1994. The annual two day bike tour. Same route as last year. Start at the Piedmont Community College (05:45 EDT!!), overnight in Farmville, and finish at the Stonewall Vineyards in Concord. Goal for 1994 is 700 riders.

DUA1--- Duathlon at Blue Ridge School Saturday 18 June 1994, 10:00 EDT. Duathlon seems to be a new term and describes a race consisting of a run followed by a bike ride followed by another run. This particular event starts and finishes at the Blue Ridge School near Dyke in Greene County.

BKV1, BKV2, BKV3-Bike Virginia Bike Tour. Monday 27 June 1994, Tuesday 28 June 1994, and Wednesday 29 June 1994.

The tour moves from place to place and spends one, two, or three days at each. Monday they ride from Waynesboro to Charlottesville and stay overnight at the Darden Towe Park (camping). Tuesday they ride to Orange and Montpelier and back to Charlottesville. Wednesday they ride from Charlottesville to Columbia in Goochland.

They expect 1400+ riders which makes this event more than twice the size of the MS 150 bike tour.

#### PUBLIC SERVICE

Take some time to look over the Public Service Events on this page. Select one or two and give Hein (N4FWA) a call and he will gladly place your name on the "Clipboard." Participation in these events can be a lot of fun. So don't just sit back and listen to the fun---join in on the fun.

It might be difficult to find enough Hams to support this tour because it lasts for three consecutive working days. They also are full day events, 06:00 - 18:00 (twelve hours!!) They want 10-12 Hams each day. So far 10 have signed up for Monday, 11 for Tuesday, and 11 for Wednesday.

We would like to have 20 or so Hams for each day so we can run shifts.
