BITS AND PIECES

The Martha Jefferson Hospital Emergency Exercise December 8, 1994

Hein Hvatum, N4FWA, and Edwina Juillet, Martha Jefferson Hospital's Director of Risk Management, met a number of times concerning the Amateur Radio operators involvement in the MJH's Emergency Exercise. This exercise was intended to simulate a bus accident on High Street. It would involve burning fuel, downed power lines and many (25+) victims with injuries of various kinds. The MEDCOM and other normal communication system were to be unavailable for the drill. Amateur Radio was to provide the main source of distant communications.

Hein and some other area Hams made a few trips to MJH to test the communication problems which might be associated with that environment. As a result it was determined that two simplex frequencies on two meters be used. One difficult area for a simplex was noted and a double dual band arrangement was set up to solve that problem. A crossband 440 MHz link would be used where one unit had a set up of 146.550/446.050 and the other unit had 446.050/147.540. The original intent to use the 146.925 repeater was dropped in favor of the aforementioned arrangement.

This Emergency Exercise involved many Emergency Coordinator personnel and other Emergency Resource persons from many rganizations-local and State. Many of these are not known to this writer so if I miss a few, I apologize. In addition to Edwina Juillet (who organized the drill), some other participants were: Walter Greene, Director, Virginia State Emergency Management Department, served as Safety Director for the Drill; Kaye Harden, Emergency Services Coordinator for Charlottesville, Albemarle County, and UVA; Hein Hvatum, ARES Emergency Coordinator; the American Red Cross; Charlottesville Fire Department; Charlottesville City Police; and the Albemarle Amateur Radio Club. Madison House (UVA) and Nursing students, Clergy, and Martha Jefferson personnel provided valuable assistance serving as victims, family, photographers, reporters, Etc.

Martha Jefferson Hospital personnel manned an Incident Command Center and several other hospital sites-including the the MJH Emergency Room. Amateur Radio operators were stationed at various locations where communications would be required. Some operators were assigned to accompany certain personnel who would be moving from place to place during the Exercise. One Ham was stationed at UVA Hospital Emergency Center to provide a communication with personnel in that facility if the need arose.

The modification of the exercise due to a real emergency concern was required. That had been planned for and was smoothly implemented. The Planning Team came together and briefly scussed the concerns and decided to cut short certain aspects of the Exercise in such a way as to avoid creating any undesired

consequences. A job well done.

Following the Exercise, a brief gathering of the participants was held in the cafeteria so that participants could be told "Thanks" for their involvement. The Amateur Radio operators were given a special "hands up" recognition by Edwina.

From the perspective of the communications personnel, a quick review indicated some concerns which need to be attended to prior to another event-real or planned. A future meeting will be held to review such matters.

A special word of thanks goes to Edwina for allowing the Amateur Radio operators to participate and to Hein for being so persuasive. There must be a "Rest of the Story" in there somewhere.

News Flash * Effective December 1, 1994, FCC began accepting Form 610 data electronically from the ARRL, W5YI and Sunnyvale VECs. Four more VECs should also be doing so shortly.

if your test was coordinated through the ARRL/VEC, license turnaround time will be approximately 23-26 days. This includes 5 days between the VE team and the VEC; 1-2 days at the VEC (in some cases the same day); and 16-19 days at the FCC.

The next local VE session will be announced later. SOCKET ASSEMBLY

CONCERNING THE DRAWINGS ABOVE

The ARES/RACES groups for Greene, Albemarle, Fluvanna, Louisa, and the City of Charlottesville have adopted a high current, positive locking connector so that equipment can be moved quickly from home to car to portable location just by connecting or disconnecting the power and antenna. If everyone is using the same connector, it allows equipment to be interchanged between operators if it become necessary (we've all had batteries die or equipment fail at inopportune times).

The DC voltage is supplied by the socket assembly. The socket assembly consists of a Radio Shack P/N 274-154 (plastic housing and 2 female power sockets) or 1 Molex 03-12-1022 and 2 Molex 18-12-1602.

The equipment is then attached to the plug assembly. The plug assembly consists of a Radio Shack P/N 274-151 (plastic housing and 2 male power pins) or 1 Molex 03-12-2022 and 2 Molex 18-12-2602.

The figure shows the basic configuration as to how the connectors go together. The pointed or roof shaped end is positive. The sockets and pins are crimped over the wire. It is also a good idea to solder the wire to the pins and sockets to improve the electrical connection. Then the socket and pins are pushed into it's respective plastic housing. If there are any questions (if in doubt, please ask), call WA4MHP LeRoy at 589-3822 or N4FWA Hein at 977-4438.
