If the desire hits that this is worth doing, then more than likely, they will work on upgrading independently or ask for assistance. With your help, soon the airwaves will start to fill with new General, Advanced, and Extra Tlass operators.

When attempting to access the 911 Autopatch, please follow the following general rule- EVEN IF NO ONE IS CURRENTLY USING THE REPEATER. Say "Emergency Call Please." Release the PTT button AND MAKE SURE YOU ARE INTO THE REPEATER. If you hear the repeater respond then continue to make your call. If you do not hear the repeater respond then you should check to see if your tone is activated.

The reason for this notice is: if the tone access is turned on, on the repeater, and your tone is not active on your rig...you can dial 911 with just the DTMF code, but you will not be able to respond to the operator. This has happened one time already. We do not want to be calling 911 and having them find an apparent "crank" caller who does not respond. More importantly, we want to be sure that the call can ultimately be made.

SB QST ARL ARLB007 ARLB007 Vanity calls soon

The FCC has announced its intention to implement a vanity call sign program, and also to resume the issuance of club and military recreation station licenses. In a January 24 news release, the Commission released a general outline of the new program.

Amateurs will be eligible to apply for a call sign of their choice in four "gates." The first group eligible to apply will be previous holders of a call sign or the close relative of a previous holder of an amateur call sign who is deceased. The second group will be Amateur Extra Class licensees, then Advanced, then all others. The FCC will announce the opening of each "gate" by public notice.

The FCC said that the first gate will open as soon as a new application form, FCC Form 610-V, is available and the Commission's licensing facility is prepared to begin processing the applications -- no sooner than April, according to FCC staff. Applications for club station licenses will be accepted as soon as the FCC's Report and Order on this matter is released. Club station call signs will be issued systematically, unless under the fourth "gate" the trustee of an existing club station applies for the call sign of a deceased member as a vanity call sign for the club.

The fee for the use of vanity call signs will be 7 dollar(s) per year, or 70 for dollar(s) a ten-year license term, according to Wireless Telecommunication Bureau staff. However, on January 12, 1995, in a notice of proposed rule making, the FCC proposed a fee of 3 dollar(s) per year, for fiscal year 1995 (which began October 1, 1994).

Amateurs will be able to list up to 25 call sign choices, from any call area, FCC staff said. It is expected that it will be several weeks before the new form 610-V is approved.

DID YOU GO TO THE FROSTFEST?

Some of these affairs grow to large proportions and they feature full programs of operating and technical interests and luncheons, perhaps a banquet and keynote speaker. Certainly, the "giant" of the whole bunch is the Dayton Hamvention with its tens of thousands of attendees (last year more than 30,000) and its tens of thousands of dollars worth of prizes.

If you can work a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Dayton at Hamvention time, by all means plan ahead and get your room reservations as early as possible. CONTESTS + INVERTED-L ANTENNA + CONTEST CLUB WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

Do you have any extra wire sitting around gathering dust? Why not use it to make an Inverted-L antenna for 160 meters so you can get on the air for the upcoming CQ World Wide 160 meter SSB contest in February? (FEBRUARY 24-26) The Inverted-L is a simple antenna you can construct that performs quite well on 160 meters. All you need to do is to cut a 1/4 wavelength piece of wire (approx. 135') and hang it in the trees so that it runs vertically upwards from the ground (where it is fed with coax) for as high as you can raise it, and then horizontally for the rest of its length. Connect the center conductor of your coax to this 1/4 wavelength element and then connect radial wires (as many as possible, but at least 2) of the same length (135') to the shield of the coax. Run these wires away from the feedpoint in a radial pattern (i.e. spokes on a wheel) and let them lay on the ground.

Using your SWR meter (and a pair of wire cutters) prune and tune the system to an acceptable swr at 1.875mhz or so (the lower part of the band is more widely used during the contest) by pruning length a few inches at a time to raise the resonant frequency. You may need to trim up to a few feet of wire off both the driven elements and radials before you get the antenna resonating at the appropriate frequency. Then fire

up your transmitter and start making ... why during the winter and the February contest

not consider QSO's on top band! Joining the AARC Contest especially active Group. The AARC what?...

is a great chance to get on and test out your new antenna and make some contacts. The February contest is sponsored by CQ Magazine, and complete rules can be found in either November, 1994 CO or December. 1994 OST.

Now, if the idea of getting on and operating a contest sounds interesting to you, why not consider joining the AARC Contest Group. The AARC what? To tell the truth no such group exists as of yet, but if there is sufficient interest from club members then we may very well see the formation of a group within the club dedicated to HF/VHF contest activity. If you are interested in the Inverted-L, the contest, or the possibility of forming a contest group, let me know.

The following was received from the ARRL VEC today 18 January:

ARRL/VEC begins full-time electronic filing: The ARRL/VEC was instructed today (1/13/95) to forward all FORM 610 application data to the FCC electronically, via EMAIL. Although we have been sending diskettes to the FCC with this data and the applicable hardcopy FORM 610 applications, effective today we must retain the FORM 610 applications at the ARRL/VEC.

We expect that this "Full" electronic filing will eventually result in FCC processing time as short as 2 to 3 days. For now, however, expect is to be about 5 days or so. After 3 weeks have passed, call us.

As we informed your team in early December, effective with the new FCC rules on 12/20/94, applicants can call the FCC at 800-322-1117 to determine whether their new license has been granted. If the license has been granted, the applicant can immediately begin using the new privileges with their FCC-issued call sign. ARRL/VEC test- session processing time is averaging 1 to 2 days. Electronic Filing of Amateur Radio FCC-Licenses

{From the Internet}

Effective Friday, January 13, 1995, the ARRL/VEC was instructed by the FCC to begin filing all Form 610 application data with them electronically, via electronic mail, and to no longer forward Form 610 applications to Gettysburg. Therefore, all new license and upgrade applications for routinely processed test sessions are being handled by the ARRL/VEC in this manner.

[For a short time, applications delayed due to missing information or applications pending at the FCC, are still being forwarded by us to the FCC via hardcopy].

Although, since December 1, 1994, the ARRL/VEC has been submitting data to the ECC

submitting data to the FCC electronically via diskette, we were also required to send the FCC the hardcopy original Form 610 application as well. Effective Friday, however, the ARRL/VEC was directed to retain the original Form 610

applications (for 15 months) for data that has been forwarded electronically to the FCC.

Total processing time for a new or upgraded FCC license is expected to be within two weeks of the test date. If three full weeks have lapsed and there is no record at FCC of a license grant, and if an application was part of a ARRL/VEC-coordinated examination, contact the ARRL/VEC at 203-666-1541 so that we can look into the application status.

To learn if an FCC license has been granted, an FCC toll free telephone number is in place. That number is 800-322-1117 (touch tone #1 after connecting, or wait for an operator). Their hours are 8:00 am to 4:30 pm eastern, M-F). Please allow a week from the test date to pass before contacting the FCC. Most licenses should be granted within two weeks.

Total processing time that we have seen varies presently from several weeks to just a few days. The quickest test session to license grant that we have experienced involved two tests (held in Illinois and Indiana) on Wednesday January 11, 1995, that resulted in FCC license grants on Friday January 13, 1995. That's new FCC licenses or upgraded licenses, as coordinated through the ARRL/VEC, in just two days! In this example, the VE team mailed their test results to the ARRL/VEC, and we processed and forwarded the results to the FCC after we screened the test documents and keyboarded the application information for the successful applicants, all in two days time. While this quick turnaround is certainly atypical for most test sessions, seven to 10 days would be a usual timeline--assuming the VE team processed and mailed the test results to the ARRL/VEC shortly after the test session. ARRL/VEC processing turnaround is routinely one (1) to two (2) business days.
