William "Bill" Cowen Uzzell

Bill (W2BNX) became a Silent Key on February 8, 1995. He was born in Brooklyn, New York, on January 14, 1910. His wife, Dorothea "Tommie" Uzzell; daughter, Laura Logie; and son, Lawrence Uzzell, survive him. Bill was retired from Sperry Marine (Great Neck, NY) where he was an electronics technician.

Bill was first licensed in 1928 as 2AFU and later held the call 2ML. He became W2BNX and then obtained W2ML as a second call. When the FCC decreed only "one call to a customer," Bill gave up W2ML for his W2BNX. He was very active on VHF with the Lake Success Radio Club (Sperry Long Island.) The QCWA awarded him a 65-year continuously-licensed certificate several years ago.

Bill was an Honorary Member of the Albemarle Amateur Radio Club.

ANOTHER REASON...

Several weeks ago, while attending the Miami Hamboree, there was opportunity to attend an IARU Region II Forum. After listening carefully to the present International President of the IARU, Dick Baldwin, W1RU, and other officers of the International and the Regional organizations, it became apparent that here was yet another place where our membership and support of the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) plays an important role.

Of course, your first question should be, what is IARU? These initials stand for the International Amateur Radio Union, an organization born 70 years ago in the mind of then President of the ARRL, Hiram Percy Maxim, W1AW. His vision saw that Amateur Radio was indeed worldwide and would require worldwide "meetings of the mind" if peace would reign on the airwaves.

Today, the IARU has more than 150 member societies from around the world. They are divided into three regional groups. Region I consists of Europe and Africa, Region II (That's us) consists of North, South and Central America plus the nearby islands, and Region III is the rest of the world, primarily Asia and the world of the Southwest Pacific Ocean. Each Region has its own governing body and its own source of operating income. Usually, this is a per-capita assessment and here in Region II, the good old USA has the largest number of hams, so the ARRL pays 7 cents per licensee per year to the Region's treasury. This money goes into the supporting of Regional publications and meetings.

The question then becomes, who supports the IARU International officers and their activities? Well, the ARRL has been the home of t International Headquarters since the birth of IARU. It is our membership money... at least a part of it... which supports the activities of the Headquarters.

Is this important? Yes, it is because the IARU is one of the few organizations which has a seat at International Frequency gatherings as an observer. It was the IARU's attendance at the World Administrative Radio Conference in 1979 (WARC79) which helped to bring us our bands at 30, 17 and 12 meters.

This didn't "just happen!" It was the result of careful planning and preparation by the IARU Regional organizations to convince their governments that support of Amateur Radio's needs was very important to their future. Our dues buy us much more than "QST" every month, Volunteer Examiner Coordination, the ARRL Field set- up, publications and technical assistance, and representation before our government. Our dues help to pay for International representation and that's where our frequencies come from. That is "another reason" for belonging to the ARRL and it's a big one!
