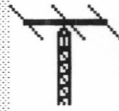

The column this month revisits a subject that was covered many, many months ago in an earlier edition. Taking a look at the dictionary definition of the word "club," and passing by the primary definitions of heavy stick, cudgel, a baseball bat and one of a suit of playing cards, it became apparent that what was meant to be our meaning of "club" was: "a number of persons associated for a common purpose or mutual benefit, particularly one supported jointly and meeting periodically." Yep, that's the one we want to address.

Next, it appeared to be wise to see what our Articles of Incorporation and our club By-Laws state. The Articles are very complete and mention key words such as: educational and scientific purposes, dissemination of information regarding our field of interest, train for public service in times of emergency, train units of licensed radio amateurs capable of maintaining communications as a public service during periods of emergency and sponsorship of experimental activities in radio communications and electronics to the benefit of the public.

The By-Laws very simply state: The Albemarle Amateur Radio Club, Inc. is a dues paying, non-stock, non-profit incorporated organization dedicated to the advancement of Amateur Radio and public service. They then provide for the

organization, duties of officers and other day-to-day activities.

If you care to read the above in its entirety, go to the AARC Web Site and see all of the words as they have been adopted by years of AARC activity. This is a recommended approach for all members. Know your organization!

By now, some of you might be wondering why these words are being written in the first place. "I've paid my dues. I attend meeting when I can or the spirit moves me. I help out in public service events sometimes. What more do you want from me?" Well AARC members, there is one more very, very important point to cover and that is simply this: Do you take any role in the actual club operation? Are you a member of a club committee? Do you volunteer when the call is made for Field Day, contest participation or some of the physical things such as maintenance of repeater sites? Those are club activities and the club needs your help. Oh, yes, the words are already ringing in my ears: "I don't have time. I don't enjoy Field Day or contests, either. I can't devote time to maintenance and repair when my own house needs lots of the same!" And, do you know... those are legitimate reasons. However, an occasional step out of character is good for each of us and is certainly worth trying.

Let's take a look at those who really support the AARC... not just with dues, but also with deeds! The Club officers and committee members give their time every month and even more frequently to be certain that the rest of us can live an easy life as "couch potatoes" or cross word puzzle solvers!

What about those who came forward when the tree fell on our Carter's Mountain repeater site so that the communications systems were kept on the air? Have you taken the time to say thanks to them? These folks don't expect every member to be able to deal with the technical problems presented by a repeater. They realize that most of us merely press the button on the HT and expect the repeater to be there at the ready for our words. They don't have time to receive accolades for their efforts. There is just too much to be done to keep our "service" image alive. However, your appreciation can be shown by asking how you might help in other ways. Some of the newest club members have been providing assistance that has been invaluable. Could you have done something similar?

Perhaps the answer is a simple NO. Perhaps you are struggling to keep the family together. You may even have some white atop your head and be unable to assist physically. Is there something you can do? Examine your experience and see if you don't have some special talent that could be of assistance. Let the president know and don't be afraid to volunteer your mind or hands. No one will laugh at you. Many will cheer your efforts.

Remember the words in the first paragraph ... "mutual benefit"... There's the answer, Come on board!!! 73...

## AARC Repeater News

Mr. Bruce R. Shifflett informed me that he is in the process of selling the property on Piney Mountain where our current tower and equipment is located. This was only to be a temporary site beginning May 1, 1999. He requested that we vacate the premise, removing all equipment in his building and the tower, in thirty days, on or before July 7, 2000.

I thanked him for the 12 months that he has generously accommodated the Club with the use of his facility's and private road privileges. Mr. Shifflett did inform that at "Tax Time" the AARC tax exempt letter was "not acceptable" by the firm doing his returns.

The 146.760 Machine was shut down around noon today, June 18, making way for the transition from Piney Mountain to "Marshall-Manor". This hopefully will be completed within 10 days or so. It was thought at first to set up "Temp" at K8EV-Richard's house but conditions were against that. 146.925 will carry the Monday Night Info Net and The N.P.E.Net on Thursday night, plus any other transmissions that need to be made.

The new location at Marshall Manor is located approximately 3 to 4 miles south of Charlottesville off Hwy 20, on the back side of the Marshall Manor subdivision on State Rte 627, 8 miles SE of Charlottesville.

## Club Business

### AARC Board Minutes June 6, 2000

Attending: Pres. Bob-K4DU; Vice Pres. Dick-W4BZW; Sect. Joe-KD4RWX; Dir. Pete-KC4UCK; Dir. Mike-N4HRO; Dir Elmer-KF4UCI; Dir. Mike-AC4ZQ.

Mike, AC4ZQ and Elmer, KF4UCI indicated that there has been a temporary change of the 146.760 repeater. We are now using a commercial repeater because the exciter in the regular repeater cannot be effectively controlled.

Mike and Elmer are to prepare a proposal for the purchase of a new repeater to replace the 146.760 repeater before July 15th. Send to Joe and Bob via email. It will be published August and September. A vote on the proposal will be held at the September meeting.

The 220 cans are in the hands of Rich Bradley. Bob will call Hein to try to get the process moved forward.

Pete indicated that Bill, KC4TQF plans to begin a class. Sign up on Sept. 6th. Start class on September 13th. At some future time, classes for General and Extra might be set up. Bob indicated that he and Harry, W2HD would likely manage those.

Mike-N4HRO will bring refreshment to the meeting.

Joe, KD4RWX indicated that the Award certificate was ready. (modify to make a signature space available). He submitted a budget for the remainder of the year in the amount of \$474.52. This is for copying newsletter, postage and Directory copying. It was approved. Joe will produce a list of old members and begin to develop a survey. The desire is to determine their interests and concerns related to the AARC.

Bob, K4DU: there is a need to notify Hams about Field Day. Someone will notify Joe about mailing.

No Board meeting in July.

August meeting will be held at the Downtown Library, Madison Room.

Motion made to adjourn. Approved.

### Regular Meeting May 9, 2000

Bob-K4DU, President presided.

Bob indicated that there would be a program change. The Dayton trip report will be canceled. He wished to take up two topics:

1. The 146.760 repeater
2. Field Day

### REPEATER

Bob, K4DU gave a brief overview of the recent history of the repeater. Mention was made of the recent notice we received to vacate the Piney Mountain site. Jimmy, K4JMY indicated we should know something final about the Marshall Manor site in about 5-7 days. Bob, K4DU indicated as long as we are a guest at any site, we could lose our location. We should think about purchasing a site. Think of the future.

Richard, K8EV offered his tower and electricity for locating the 146.76 repeater temporarily.

Harry, W2HD noted that the Monday Night Info Net has already been moved to the 146.925 repeater. He also recommended that we get off Piney!

Bob, K4DU indicated that the present 146.760 repeater might need to be replaced. Elmer, KF4UCI commented that the exciter drifts and may need to be replaced. He made reference to phase modulation. Joe, W2PVY explains some differences between phase modulation and true frequency modulation.

Howard, KG4FYF reported that on June 4 he heard some of our Hams on frequencies outside the Ham bands, in the 450-470 MHz range. Several individuals quickly indicated that what he heard was image problems. A quick set of calculations demonstrated the frequency he would have heard the signals on. He confirmed the result.

Elmer, KF4UCI suggested that if Marshall Manor happens, we should start off with hard line. Jerry, WD4CEN moved that if we move to Marshall Manor, a good multi-year agreement should be obtained, and that we install hard line. The motion was seconded and passed.

Greg, N4PGS noted that there we may need to look at the equipment also. We may need to move rather quickly.

Joe, W2PVY said that we have not had good leadership of the Technical Committee, such as coordination of repeater macros. Bob, K4DU noted that the Technical Committee Chair was not here to defend himself. Donna, KG4FOL asked, if we couldn't move more quickly? Bob indicated that the Board had just set into motion a process for the Technical Committee to bring forth a plan to change the 146.760 repeater. Harry, W2HD moved that a letter be written to Mike, AC4ZQ indicating that he is removed as Technical Committee Chair. Seconded by Joe, W2PVY. A vigorous discussion ensued. Harry asked if Mike had called

anyone about not coming to the meeting. Joe, KD4RWX indicated that Mike had called him and Mike had some visitors to entertain. Harry asked if there was a specific reason. Joe replied that Mike said what he said.

Jimmy, K4JMY spoke about the evolution of the temporary Piney Mountain site. Dave, K4DND said that there was a lot of frustration in working in the Technical Committee and that caused individuals to go out on their own.

Bob, K4DU asked if for any further discussion. Joe, KD4RWX commented that he was very uncomfortable with the method of the motion. He believed it could be resolved with a personal contact with Mike by the President. After all, the President nominated him.

Harry, W2HD requested that his motion be withdrawn, if the seconder would concur. Joe, W2PVY reluctantly agreed. Harry changed the motion to: The President is to have a conversation with the Technical Committee Chair, to request that he step down as Chair. Seconded by Joe, W2PVY. Discussion: Need to have a replacement. Ernie, W2EIU commented about resignation. Vote: Motion passed.

Harry, W2HD moved: All of the AARC equipment be removed as soon as possible. Seconded. Vote: Motion passed.

Dave, K4DND moved: We will relocate 146.760 repeater to Richard, K8EV's house. Hein, N4FWA seconded it. Motion passed.

Greg, N4PGS moved an amendment: Add the equipment will not remain there longer than 6 months. Seconded by Howard, KG4FYF. Amendment motion failed.

Ernie, W2EIU moved: The AARC will buy a new 2 meter repeater and the Technical Committee be empowered to make the purchase. Seconded. Motion passed. Amendment: Ask Technical Committee to research what is required and present it at the July meeting. Approved.

Joe, KD4RWX pointed out that the Board is required to sign any repeater site agreement. Bob agreed. Richard, K8EV indicated he knows someone who lives on Flat Top Mountain. Dave, K4DND indicated that covenant restrictions and elevation/coordination problems would be faced in trying to locate a repeater on Flat Top.

### **FIELD DAY**

Bob, K4DU indicated that no one had stepped forward to assume the Field Day Chair. He indicated that his watch was not going to be the first one not to have Field Day. We will have Field Day. He has written for permission to use the Earlsville Volunteer Fire Department site again. No response yet. He suggested that Ernie, W2EIU might do the publicity again this year, since he has done such an excellent job in prior years.
