

Participation in contests is a popular activity for radio amateurs that provides a lot of enjoyment and at the same time, sharpens operating skills. Observing those that excel at it, it almost seems like an art. A number of contests are scheduled this fall and winter and it is a good time to look at this activity from an experienced contest operator's perspective. Harry Dannals, W2HD has many hours of experience operating contests and has agreed to give a talk at the November 14 club meeting titled "Contesting -- It's a Fun Thing". Harry always gives a very interesting and entertaining talk and I am sure that you will not want to miss this one.

There is another big event scheduled for November 14 and many of us have our fingers crossed that it goes well. The next-generation Phase 3D satellite is scheduled for launch on this date and hopefully we can make the announcement of a satellite in orbit at the time of the club meeting. If you have never used one of these OSCAR satellites in a highly elliptical Molnyia orbit, I highly recommend it. It is possible to talk, full duplex, to stations thousands of miles away. These contacts can be very relaxed and last for long periods of time since the satellite's position in azimuth and elevation does not change very rapidly as the satellite approaches apogee. The latest version will have many more options for uplink and down link frequency combinations and will make heavy use of amateur microwave frequencies. We will have a talk at a club meeting early next year that will provide all the details for getting up and running with this exciting amateur radio communications mode.

Harry, W2HD

Well now, isn't that a strange looking subject for an article? Yes, you might think so, but this is going to be... believe it or not... an article on message (traffic) handling. Just wait and see... No fooling!

Some of the folks who read these words will remember their experiences with the G.I. traffic world when they were communicators. For example, I was a radioman in the Navy and sent and received many a message during my years in that capacity.

You might remember the typical headings of military messages... stations of origin, stations for whom the message was to be sent, information addressees and the all-important date time group. Lots... maybe all... was encrypted.

After several years of traffic handling, many of us became civilians and many of us also became Radio Amateurs. And... guess what... many of us became traffic-handlers in the Ham world. That's where I found myself during the early days of W2TUK... my first Ham call. The basic rules were the same: relay the message exactly as received and as quickly as possible. It was almost the same as the service days except that we did not wear uniforms! However, while the rules of the game were similar, there was a new heading and addressing in the Ham world. Looking at a message heading, you would see: "NR 1 W2TUK CK15 HEMPSTEAD, NY 2000 OCT 20" and the address would be the same as a postal address: name, street, city and state (No Zip, yet) and possibly a telephone number. The same message might be sent to more than one addressee and they were called "book" messages and only the different headings were sent while the text remained the same.

As the years flashed by, the National Traffic System (NTS) was born and a nation-wide system of local nets, state nets, area nets, regional nets and national, high-level relay nets, were established. The system was in place. Message headings eventually became what they look like today: "NR1 ROUTINE HXG W2HD 15 ANYWHERE USA 2000 OCT 20." Precedence and handling instructions had been added. The address was still the address of the recipient.

However, over this period, two new approaches to handling traffic were developed... the Packet Network and E-mail. While some of the older, dyed in the wool, traffic ladies and gentlemen winced in pain, it didn't take too long for most Hams to recognize that Packet was faster (most of the time) and E-mail was a quantum jump ahead of all. A typical Packet address would be: W2HD@WA4TFZ.CVA.USA.NOAM. Messages would be entered at a Packet station and routed via the various parameters following the call sign of the station (W2HD.)

E-mail is something that almost everyone using a computer recognizes at a glance. A typical address would be the title of this article" w2hd@imaham.com. However, it is more correctly noted as w2hd@arrl.net. or HDannals@prodigy.net. The World-wide Web (WWW) is the "in thing" today and it's as fast as greased lightning. It's interesting to those of us who have lived through the rapid development of communications to see the latest in action. Do we want to return to the military procedures of WWII? Hardly! But... and there is my favorite "BUT" again... let's not lose our skill in handling traffic in the good old NTS format.

Why, you ask? Isn't the new system rapid and error free? The answer is a resounding YES! BUT (that word again) what happens when the telephone lines go down and the

WWW and its E-mail are floundering in the dark? The system goes dead, fellows and gals, and we, as usual, must depend on the tried and true Radio Amateurs... their HT's, battery-powered gear and know how to keep things running.

Soooooo, the next time we have one of those old-fashioned drills with NTS format, get behind it and learn the procedures. No gripes... let's do the job or be prepared to do the job when necessity demands that performance.


