This being the second Board Meeting in succession without a quorum, Bob K4DU expressed his disappointment and wondered if some missing members were aware the location of Board Meetings is no longer at the Library.

Informal discussions of club business did take place. Items covered were:

Howard brought to the meeting a Radiosonde (Weather Bureau) for examination by the membership.

The meeting now turned to activities for 2003. Bob requested in put from the membership as to programs and presentations desired for the coming year.

The next item of discussion was the club committee structure. It was pointed out that the Bylaws of the AARC list the various committees and their membership. The attempt to revise the Bylaws a number of years ago was a project never completed. Bob pointed out that the club needed a chair for the Technical, Publications and Membership Committees.

Ralph made the Treasurer's Report. In summary the report indicated as of FYTD Nov. 30, 2002 that total revenues were \$3463.50; total expenses were \$1667.72; showing excess revenues of \$1795.78. Special Fund balances showed AARC Fund \$2776.23; Repeater Fund \$1062.68; Packet Radio \$78.51. Ralph pointed out that while on the surface this appeared to be very encouraging, it should be noted that dues collected for 2002 were \$1460, expenses were \$1667.72, thus showing a deficit of \$207.72. Had the club not sold much of the equipment contributed by Sperry we would be in the "red." This indicates a need to increase club membership.

# The membership was reminded that annual dues are due in January. Dues remain at \$20 for an individual and \$25 for a family membership.

Bob called for approval of the November 2002 AARC General Meeting Minutes. The motion was second and approved without amendment as they appeared in the Beacon.

With no further business, Bob called for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made, second and approved. The meeting closed at 8:45 P.M. Refreshment followed the meeting.
