

A great place to try your contesting luck is on the QSO Parties that take place throughout the year. QSO Parties are more relaxed than the big contests, and they are a great way to make a dent in other activities like "Worked All States" or the "USA-CA Counties Award".

The Virginia QSO Party is sponsored by the Sterling Park ARC. These are the same folks who run one of our four-land QSL Bureaus. The contest runs from 1800Z on March 20 to 0200Z on March 22. For information on suggested frequencies, the exchange, scoring and log submission go to <a href="http://www.qsl.net/sterling">http://www.qsl.net/sterling</a>.

This year to hone operating and contest skills the AARC will participate in the contest in a big way. We encourage all members to get on the air and work as many stations as possible. If you provide K4DU with a copy of your submitted contest log no later that April 10<sup>th</sup> and you will be eligible to win any one of a number of awards. The details will be announced at the March meeting of the AARC.

If you don't have HF privileges team up with someone who does. The AARC will recognize multi-op efforts in its awards programs. Those of you who do have HF privileges, I encourage you to open your shacks to those who don't.

### 2004 Virginia QSO Party Rules

### Sponsor

Sponsored by the Sterling Park Amateur Radio Club, Call Box 599, Sterling VA, 20167.

### **Object**

To promote amateur radio activity in the 95 Virginia Counties and 39 Independent Cities.

### **Dates**

March 20 - 22, 2004. Contest times are from 1800 UTC on Saturday March 20 through 0200 UTC on Monday March 22.

### **Entries**

Submit logs, summary and dupe sheets (for greater than 200 QSO's) by April 15, 2004 to the VA QSO Party, Call Box 599, Sterling, VA 20167 or by email to nq4k@arrl.net. Include SASE or email address for summary of contest results. A \$1.00 donation to help defray the costs of printing and mailing is encouraged.

### **Contest Rules**

Work fixed stations once per band/mode. Out-of-State stations work Virginia stations only. No cross-mode or repeater QSO's. A Virginia Mobile transmitter must remain on one band for a 15 minute period starting with the first logged QSO on that band for that time period. Work Virginia Mobiles in each Virginia County or Independent City from which they operate. Mobiles and Fixed stations on County or Independent City lines count as one QSO and only one County/Independent City multiplier. Multipliers are only counted once. Contacting the same Virginia County, Independent City, State, Province or Country using a different band or mode counts only as a new QSO, not as a new multiplier. Virginia Mobiles receive a bonus of 100 additional points for each Virginia County/Independent City from which they log a valid QSO. For award purposes

Fixed and Mobile operation will be considered separately, please submit separate logs for Fixed and Mobile operation. Spotting nets, DX clusters, etc., may be used to locate other stations - no self-spotting permitted. All operators must observe the limits of their operator's license. Multiple operator stations should indicate all operators by name and call sign.

Paper or electronic Logs, Summary and Dupe sheets (200 or more QSO's) are required. Summary sheet should include name, mailing address, call sign, number of Virginia Counties/Independent Cities in which operated, license class, club name and a signed statement that all contest rules and regulations have been observed. Dupe sheets by band and mode are required for 200 or more QSO's. For Club Competition (minimum of 3 valid club entries), be sure to indicate club name on summary sheet and log. Contestants using computer logging and reporting software are required to verify scoring and duping to ensure contest rules have been followed.

### **Scoring**

QSO's count 1 point per Phone, 2 points per CW, and 3 points per contact made with a Virginia Mobile (Phone or CW). Virginia Fixed Stations multiply QSO points by the total number of Virginia counties, Virginia Independent cities, U. S. States, Canadian Provinces and DX Countries. No extra DX multiplier for U.S. (including Alaska and Hawaii) and Canada. Virginia Mobiles, add to your Virginia Fixed Station score 100 bonus points for each Virginia County or Independent City from which you log a valid mobile QSO. Outside of Virginia, multiply QSO points by the total number of Virginia Counties (95) and Independent Cities (39) worked to obtain final score. All stations add 500 bonus points for a contact with K4NVA the club station of the Sterling Park Amateur Radio Club.

### **Exchange**

Exchange QSO number and QTH (Virginia County or Independent City for VA stations; State, Province or DX Country for others). Virginia Mobile Stations log QSO's by Virginia Independent City or County of operation. Identify all QSO's with band/mode, sequential QSO number sent/received and date/time of contact in UTC. Please follow standard contest practices by making and responding to "CQ Virginia QSO Party" calls. Multiple Transmitter stations may maintain sequential QSO numbers independently for each transmitter.

### **Frequencies**

160 meters and up, except **no WARC band QSO's permitted**.

**Suggested frequencies**: CW--1805 KHz and 50 KHz up from band edge on others. PHONE --1845, 3860, 7260, 14270, 21370 and 28370 KHz. Novice/Tech Plus--10 KHz up from the edge of the CW band and 28370 KHz on PHONE.

VHF -- 50.125, 144.200 (CW & SSB), 146.580 and 223.50 MHZ. UHF--446.00 MHz All frequencies plus or minus QRM and nets. No Repeater or cross-mode QSO's.

### **Operator Categories**

Single Operator - One person performs all operating and only one transmitter may be on the air at a time

**Mobile** - Single or Multiple individuals operating Mobile under a single call sign with only one transmitter on the air at a time. A mobile station is self-contained and capable of legal motion (land, water or air) while operating. Motion is optional, and discouraged, during operation.

**Club** - Minimum of three valid contest entries each indicating club affiliation.

**Multi Operator / Single Transmitter** - Two or more operators with one transmitter on the air at one time.

Multi Operator / Multi Transmitter - Two or more operators with two or more transmitters on the air at one time.

**Expedition** - One or more operators of a single transmitter station that moves between two or more Virginia locations during the course of the contest. All equipment, power supplies and antennas must be transported to each operating site.

### **AWARDS**

### **Plaques**

### **High Virginia Single Operator All Mode**

Awarded to the Virginia Single Operator Fixed Station with the highest total score.

### **High Virginia Mobile**

Awarded to the Virginia Mobile Station with the highest total score resulting from only Mobile operation. May be multiple operators but only one transmitter on the air at a time under a single call sign.

### **High Virginia Club Combined Score**

Awarded to the Virginia Club (minimum of three valid club member entries) with the highest total combined club member scores.

### **High Single Operator VHF Only**

Awarded to the Single Operator Station with the highest total score resulting from only VHF (1.25, 2 & 6 meter) operation.

### **High Virginia QRP All Mode**

Awarded to the Single Operator Station with the highest total score resulting from only QRP (output RF power less than 5 watts at all times) operation within the state of Virginia.

### **High QRP All Mode Outside Virginia**

Awarded to the Single Operator Station with the highest total score resulting from only QRP (output RF power less than 5 watts at all times) operation outside the state of Virginia.

### **High Single Operator Outside Virginia All Mode**

Awarded to the Single Operator Station located outside the state of Virginia with the highest total score.

### **High Single Operator Novice/Tech All Mode**

Awarded to the Single Operator station receiving the highest total score where the operator holds a valid Novice, Technician or Technician Plus License.

### **High Single Operator CW Only**

Awarded to the Single Operator Station with the highest total score resulting from only CW operation.

### **High Multiple Station**

Awarded to the Multiple Operator Multiple Transmitter station with the highest total score.

### **High Multiple Single Station**

Awarded to the Multiple Operator Single Transmitter station with the highest total score.

### **High DX Station All Mode**

Awarded to the DX station with the highest total score.
