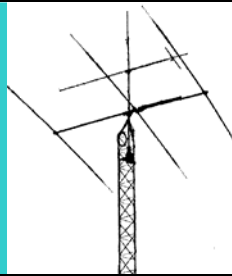

Club Business

AARC Board Minutes June 12, 2007

Board Members Present: Jay, K4AZV (Prez); Bob, K4DU (Treas.); Marty, AG4DN (Sec'y); Bill, AD6JV, Gordon WW4GW; Josh, KG4NGV. Members Absent: John, KI4DJT (Veep); Kevin, K4BDR.

Jay opened the meeting at 6:35 PM. Jay called for reports from committee chairs.

Bill informed the Board that he will no longer be able to perform the duties of Emergency Coordinator and chair public service events. Effective the end of August he will give up the duties of chair of public service events. Jay thanked Bill for his past service and asked Bill and the Board to look for a public service events coordinator. There were no immediate nominations but all agreed to look for an appropriate candidate.

Jay noted that the NOAA Weather Service Station on 163.45 MHz has been off the air for the past week or so. It is believed that lightning or another mishap has occurred at the station. The station at Manassas, 162.45 MHz is coming in quite strong in this area. With the hurricane season upon us Jay felt it was important to check on the reason for the 163.45 station being off the air considering that all of Central Virginia may not be able to pick up the Manassas station. Bill will check on the situation.

Jay reported that the coordination for the 925 repeater on Heard MTN is nearing approval. The holdup has been corrected. Tim KG4HOT reported that he will need new cables for the 925 repeater. There are also some modifications and additions that are necessary for the shed to become operational. The cables have to be made to match the equipment layout in the shed. The layout will be worked on by Tim. Location for the 2 meter and 440 repeaters have to be decided on. This will determine the cable lengths necessary for hook up of the various components of the system. Some technical questions still need to be resolved as well in regard to tone access. The Tech Committee will meet and resolve the problems.

Gordon informed the Board that the club cannot submit the Field Day results for this year. The club violated the rules covering set up time by setting up too early; therefore the results cannot be accepted.

There followed a general discussion on the privileges of being a member of the club. The possibility of limited

membership for repeater use only was discussed among many other related issues.

Another item of general discussion at the Board was "is there a need for formal classes for the three levels of Amateur Operator?" The ten-week classes, one night a week, are a thing of the past. The weekend classes where the students come to class already having covered the material and have a question and answer session followed by a testing session has been tried in the past and did not work out. The use of Elmer's on an individual basis was also covered. No hard and fast decisions were made, however the use of Elmer's or the one day weekend approach seemed the best way to approach the issue.

With no further business, Jay called for a motion to close the board meeting at 7:30 PM. A motion was made, seconded and approved with no comment

Regular Meeting June 12, 2007

Jay opened the meeting at 7:40 PM. The introduction of members and guests followed.

Jay called for a motion to approve the June 2007 meeting minutes as they appeared in the July Beacon. A motion was made, seconded and approved with no comment or changes.

Jay went on to discuss the NOAA weather radio problems we are currently encountering. (See Board Minutes).

Bob gave a financial report. There is currently \$4422.31 in the club checking account. This month the club paid for its annual liability insurance (in excess of \$600).

Bill addressed the membership about the ARES training session scheduled for Saturday 21 July at Martha Jefferson Hospital. This training is for all ARES members in District 3. He went on to describe the 4 July public service event parade in Scottsville. Four members of the club were requested to provide radio communication. The County Police radio system has very poor to no coverage in this location. The club performed a very vital function. Bill announced that he will be giving up the position of public service coordinator in August. Jay noted that the club had many skilled individuals that are familiar with the procedures for all our recurring public service events. This should make the job of the replacement for Bill relatively easy. A volunteer was called for. This is a great opportunity to organize and plan a public service event and is excellent experience for emergency situations. The membership was requested to review and recommend candidates for the position.

Gordon announced that the next VE session will be held on 15 September. Time and place TBA.

Tim reported on the progress being made on the 925 repeater and the need for cables to suit the situation. (See Board Minutes) There was a general discussion following

that dealt with the possibility of having two repeater antennas on one mast and the potential problems technically as well as with the property owners. The Tech Committee will meet and come up with a workable plan of action to accommodate the two repeaters.

Jay reminded the membership that the **annual picnic and Tail Gate fest will be on Tuesday 14 August 6:30 PM at Shelter 1 at McIntire Park**. There will be no regular scheduled meeting in August.

Programs for the balance of the year were covered.

In September a nominating committee will be appointed to select nominees for club officers for 2008. Elections will be held at the October club meeting.

Also at the October meeting we will have a presentation on DX'ing. In November we will have a presentation covering general radio and antenna safety.

With no further business Jay called for a motion to close the meeting at 8:20 PM. A motion was made, seconded and approved with no comments.

Public Service Coordinator Job Opening

The time has come to pass on my responsibilities as Public Service Coordinator to another member of AARC. I took this job on two seasons ago, along with Albemarle County Emergency Coordinator, because both jobs were vacant. Now I have increased responsibilities in other areas that make it very difficult for me to do both jobs well, so the time has come for someone else to step up to take on the public service job.

Let me be the first to say that coordinating public service events, by itself, doesn't take that much time. There are two or three major bicycle events each year that make up the bulk of the job responsibility, plus a few others that are easy to cover with just a few hams. What is needed is a year or two of experience participating in these events so you understand the resources required. The benefits we deliver to these events by providing ham radio communications are very real and measurable, and well recognized by the organizers. And ham radio in general and AARC in particular get tremendous visibility to everybody involved in the event, riders, organizers, and spectators alike. We need that positive exposure as we fight to protect spectrum, defend

against BPL and other nasties, and put our antennas in the air.

Another aspect of public service events is that they provide excellent tactical training for emergency communications. No amount of drilling can equal the experience of hams getting out into the field and solving communications problems on the spot. In this respect participation in public service events is a requirement for learning and maintaining emergency communications skills needed to have an effective ARES/RACES group.

So there you have it. Somebody please come forward to take on the public service job for AARC. You will get plenty of cooperation from me as Albemarle County EC, and you might even have fun.

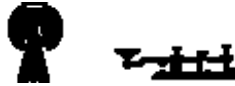
