President's Corner

Where is the time going? It seems that just a few weeks ago we were looking forward to the Dayton Hamvention and now it's almost the Fourth of July. In the interim we had a very successful MS-150 tour and I thank all that participated in any way, but especially those that served in planning and executing the plans. I won't try to mention everyone as there will be someone I'll miss but thanks to all.

Now we are gearing up for Field Day next weekend. Of course you're reading this after the fact so bear with me and take this for advice for next year. Things are coming together; we have an excellent promotion by the Public Relations Committee (Jim Wilson K4BAV Chairman) and excellent planning by the field Day Chairman (Larry Eicher K4JZQ and his team members). If all the public service folks who have been invited attend we will have more of them than us! Planning and setting up for FD requires lots and lots of work and while we have quite a few that plan to be there more are always needed. There has been a lack of interest in signing up for both operating slots and supplying equipment and antennas. We have to drag most anyone to the website to sign up. Why are most not signing up? The spread sheets to do this are easy to use and it only takes five minutes or less to

do so. Next year please sign up early so we know we have enough operators. At the minimum we should have five operators at any one time to man the three main stations, the free VHF station and the GOTA station. We also need someone to man the public information booth as well as other duties which mean six to eight people are needed 24 hours every hour to do this properly. Well maybe we could drop the information booth and GOTA station after 8 p.m. Saturday and start up again around 10 a.m. Sunday. Still we don't have the personnel signed up to even keep three stations on the air for the 24 hours. Why? Is there really not enough interest in FD except for the core group of FD operators? Do family duties prevent you from operating? Do you feel you're not proficient or trained to do a contest type operation? Does a medical condition prevent you from coming out to the site? If you're just not interested then maybe we can't help, if not proficient we can have classes and promote smaller contest during the year to get you up to snuff. If family intervenes maybe we can put a bug in their ear or maybe not! If you have health issues we can try to have a doctor on site. You get the idea, let us know why you can't attend or chose not to attend and we will try to help you out for next year.

The operation of Amateur Radio is what it's all about, if you don't get on the air when you can then why go to all the work to get licensed. If you feel you don't have the knowledge to set up a station then let us know and we will get a team together to build your station, get antennas up and in general advise you. In fact if you feel that there is a need for this type of instruction at a future meeting, let us know so we can plan. If looking at the ads in QST and the price of equipment turns you off, we can help in advising on good, much lower cost equipment though it may be used. Used does not mean worn out. I haven't bought a new radio in over 35 years except for VHF/UHF.

Our July meeting is coming up very soon after FD so please put it on your calendar NOW! If not you might, like me, forget about it. Do it now!
