#### **President's Corner** By Ed Berkowitz - N3US



During the past several weeks, I have spent a considerable amount of time in my basement shack organizing it and tuning around the HF bands. Since the HF band conditions have recently been quite marginal, I have also been monitoring the Club's VHF repeaters. At first I thought I must have cut the coax to my Diamond VHF/UHF vertical while rewiring some duplex outlets in my shack, as I often heard no activity on any of our Club's repeaters for hours at a time. The AARC has and continues to invest heavily in our repeaters in order to ensure that we have the best and most reliable possible coverage in our area. Many of us have multiple base, mobile, and HT rigs that seem to be collecting dust. So I urge everyone to start using our repeaters, pausing between transmissions for any "breakers" needing assistance or wishing to join your QSO. Might we consider developing a repeater-monitoring group, charged with increasing the "friendliness" of our repeaters?

The Richmond Frostfest is just around the corner -Saturday, February 6th, 8:30 a.m. – 3 p.m. at the Richmond Raceway Complex, 600 East Laburnum Avenue. Those of us who have purchased early bird tickets can enter at 8 a.m.. The

AARC is renting three tables, and Club members may bring their excess equipment to sell. Bob Pattision, K4DU, is heading up this effort. This is an excellent way to clean out your basements and for the Club to earn a small fee from the sales. The AARC receives 10% of gross sales except from sales by those members who have volunteered to staff the tables for a 2-hour rotation. If you place items on the table for sale, you are responsible for retrieving them if they are still unsold when you leave. The team's object was to get Harry Dannals W2HD back on the air after many months absence from the airwaves. Hams across the Nation have welcomed the news that Harry is now back on the air.

## An Intercepted Letter of interest

Dear Mr. Eicher:

Thank you for your recent correspondence concerning H.R. 1301, the Amateur Radio Parity Act. I appreciate your taking the time to express

your thoughts on this important matter. I am grateful for the privilege of representing you and serving as a voice for the citizens of Virginia's Fifth District.

As you may know, H.R. 1301 was introduced by Representative Adam Kinzinger (IL-16) on March 4, 2015. H.R. 1301 seeks to direct the Federal Communications Commission to extend to private land use restrictions its rule relating to reasonable accommodation of amateur service communications. H.R. 1301 has been referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce. Please be assured I will show your concerns every consideration when H.R. 1301 comes before the U.S. House of Representatives for action.
