## AARC Meeting Minutes 11/10/2020

Meeting called to order by Larry Eicher, VP presiding at 7:00 pm. 31 members in attendance. Did introductions.

Larry introduced Allen Graves, AG4VA, to give presentation on SOTA.

SOTA is Summits on the Air and is an award scheme for hams that encourages portable operation in mountainous areas. Started in Great Britain in 2002 and Allan got involved for last 18 months. SOTA is operational in nearly a hundred countries around the world. Each summit earns the activators and chasers a score which is related to the height of the summit. Each country participating has an association which defines the recognized SOTA summits. VA association is W4V-VA.

Main website is sota.org.uk. Basically it is organized with activators and chasers. Activators hike to mountain summit and setup ham gear and antenna. Chasers are hams who try to contact the activators.

There is a SOTA WATCH 3 tab which lists who is on the air. SOTLAS is a map of where activators are located. SOTA website includes a Results & Summits database. Chasers can submit log entry for any contacts they made.

Scores related to elevation of summit. Need at least 500 ft. from valley to mountain top. There are 150,000 summits globally in 100 countries. Only one-third of summits are activated. Allan gave local example of Stony Man mountain in Shenandoah, W4V/SH-002. Received extra points due to winter. Need to do 4 QSO's minimum to activate summit.

You can click on maps in SOTA website and get route to summit. Safety is most important priority for SOTA. It is essential to print out topographic maps. Uses caltopo.com. Print to pdf and print hard copy of customized topo map for summit. Use GPS and compass to hike to summit. Make sure to file hiking plan to someone not on hike.

Recommended equipment to bring: QRP rig (less weight), batteries, HT radio, antenna and cables. See <a href="https://www.rei.com/learn/expert-advice/ten-essentials.html">www.rei.com/learn/expert-advice/ten-essentials.html</a> for good advice on what supplies to bring with on hike. Your pack weight should be about 10% of body weight (20-25 lbs.).

There are various apps that are helpful: SOTA GOAT or SPOTTER, hamgps, hamclock, SOTA finder, repeater directory.

Can be successful on QRP at 5 watts.

Activation zone is 25 meters or 82 ft from mountain top.
