Presentation by John Green, KX4P

"Seeing the invisible universe - Radio Astronomy"

John Green is from Chapel Hill, NC and used to be active in AARC. 65 years a ham. Worked at NRAO, NSF and other places.

His presentation is about a trip he made to Green Bank observatory recently. John talked about visual vs radio astronomy. He reviewed some history of optical astronomy and then described radio astronomy history. He reviewed discovery of electromagnetic spectrum in 19th century and development of RA telescopes by Karl Jansky and Grote Reber who conducted first sky survey in RA.

Objects seen by RA include Big Bang, center of Milky Way, black holes, quasars, etc.

Karl Jansky investigated radio noise on 1930's radiotelephone service. Found sources of noise to be thunderstorms near and distant, sun and the Milky Way.

Grote Reber built first parabolic disk radio telescope, 9 meters diameter and steerable. Found noise sources from center of Milky Way.

Next major event was discovery by Penzias & Wilson at the Bell labs center in Holmsdel NJ of the Cosmic Microwave Background (CMB) radiation. Aerocibo RA telescope in Puerto Rico was largest RA telescope in world until its collapse a few years ago.

The Society of Amateur Radio Astronomers held its annual conference in August of this year. They were able to get close up look at new Byrd RT at Green Bank, 100 meters diameter, fully steerable, bands 200 MHz to 116 GHz. Pointing accuracy is 2 arc-seconds.

Rest of talk showed slides of group visiting latest RT. QnA followed.

Raffle held.
