PUBLIC SERVICE

AARC provides support to several bike-touring or foot events each year

The largest recent event was the "Ride to Defeat ALS" which involved 22 Hams last year

We frequently help out with events led by other clubs and they help us out as well!

EDUCATION & VE SESSIONS

- AARC runs ham radio courses typically twice per year (Winter/Spring & Fall)
 - Technican
 - General (usually only one General course for 2-3 Tech courses)
 - Currently courses are run primarily via ZOOM allowing distant students to participate
- VE Sessions led by Hank Perritt, K9KDF
 - AARC runs 4 VE sessions per year (March, June, September, December) with some special sessions associated with completion of classes
 - Typically, 8-11 AARC VE's participate each year

FIELD DAY 1995

- 1995 was an unusual Field Day year because of what happened immediately afterwards! 1,052 QSOs on June 24 -25
- But on June 27 the rains descended on Madison County with over 20 inches in 10 hours causing major flooding
- Fortunately, the Field Day gear had not yet been unpacked, so AARC hams were able to rapidly set up an 80-m HF station in Madison at the Emergency HQ that operated for 26 hours



The station was used to request additional helicopters for SAR and pass on Red Cross Status Reports to Richmond.

Hams involved were: KE4UKW, KC4TQF, KE40MD, N8EBM, NM4R, N4WJQ, KE4NHP, KE4DDQ, AD4TU, KC4UCK, KJ40P, KE4HIA, KD4ASI, N4FWA, W2HD, W2EIU, WA4MHP, K04EV, KE40ID, KF4AFE, KD4EMU, KD4RWX, KD4CUJ, N6AAR and KC4MYI.
